INDONESIA'S TRAVEL RESTRICTIONS DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

The Indonesian government imposed an entry and transit ban on all foreigners since 02 April 2020 with the exception of the following:

- Holders of Temporary Stay Permit (ITAS) or Permanent Stay Permit (ITAP);
- Holders of Diplomatic Visa, Service Visa, Diplomatic Stay Permit or Service Stay Permit;
- Medical Aid Workers or Food Sustenance Workers for Humanitarian Purposes; and
- Expatriates working on strategic national projects.

Foreigners/passengers who are eligible to enter Indonesia must comply with the following requirements:

- Possession of valid health certificate (in English language) issued by Health Authority from their respective country. The health certificate must be valid within seven (7) days;
- The health certificate must state that the foreigner/passenger is free from respiratory disease and residing for at least fourteen (14) days in a country with no eminent case of Covid-19;
- Statement of compliance stating that the foreigner/passenger agreed to be self-quarantine for fourteen (14) days.

The above information is subject to change upon the issuance of corresponding orders from the Indonesian government.
